I got to talk to two vets who were from World War II. One was a PBY Catalina pilot who told me his job was to sneak around the clouds to find the Japanese ships out in the South Pacific Ocean. He said they typically flew for 12-13 hours!. He said they did "DUMBO" missions to rescue downed pilots.

The second vet was in Europe – he was a tank driver and went all the way through into Germany (Via the battle of the Bulge). He told me that if they had to fight the regular generals (instead of that paper hanger Hitler) it would have gone much worse. Both of these guys appreciated us being there. There were pictures of what they looked like when they were in the service in a special room.

We got the honor of participating with the Color Guard proudly displaying our Troop and American flags!

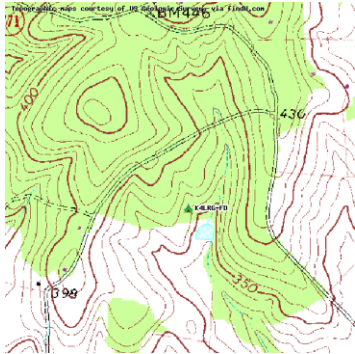

Boy Scout Troop/Venture Crew 141 Annual Recharter

It is time to renew Boy Scouts of America membership for returning scouts and leaders. Everyone who wants to continue their membership in the BSA needs to recharter. New scouts who have recently joined the unit have paid a small transfer fee or pro-rated registration fee. This was to cover scouting activities for the remainder of 2010. The rechartering fee is a separate fee now due for ALL scouts and leaders for the full year 2011.

These fees include Scout registration, Boy's Life subscription, and unit activity fee. Purchase of a troop 141 red T-Shirt is optional for another \$5. This "shirt" comes in very handy for events that don't require a uniform, and it allows the boys to feel like a part of the team. Sweatshirts are also available for overnight camping activities.

Families with more than one scout in the troop/year will have a reduced price for the additional scouts. Assuming there will be only one Boy's Life magazine subscription for that household, the fee will be reduced by \$12.00 for each additional scout.

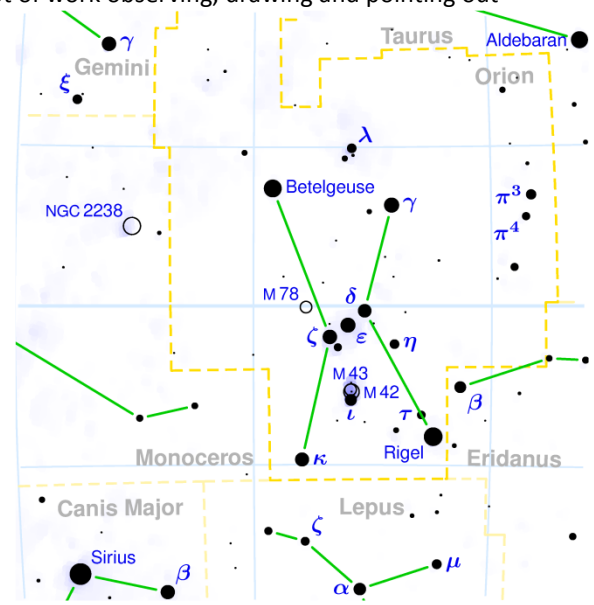
ASTRONOMY MERIT BADGE:

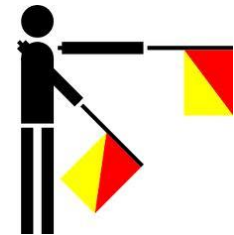
There will be FOLLOW UP classes to test out on Your Signal flags and Morse Code.

Yellowstone Update: IMPORTANT NOVEMBER CHANGE PLEASE READ

The summer 2011 trip to Yellowstone National Park will be July 21-28. The current plan is to leave at 7 AM on Thursday July 21 from the troop shed and drive to Richfield, Utah where we will be staying at the Hampton Inn. The room cost for 4 occupants is \$81/night. Currently we have 15 rooms reserved at this group rate. We plan to arrive in Yellowstone on the evening of July 22. We have a group campsite reserved for 60 people (Grant Village campground). Activities at Yellowstone are TBD and those who are going are encouraged to suggest activities. We will leave Yellowstone on Wednesday July 27, spend the night in the same Hampton Inn in Richfield, Utah and return to Tucson on Thursday July 28.



The final cost is yet to be determined but here are the costs so far:
\$20-40/night/person for hotel (depending on 2, 3 or 4 person occupancy)
\$15-20/person for camping and admission fees at Yellowstone (\$100/night for a

group of 40-60 campers. The rate will drop to \$90-some dollars if we fall below 40 people.) The other major costs will be gas and food both on the road and while camping. The current plan while at Yellowstone is to cook as a group for breakfast and dinner and have lunches (sandwiches, etc.) at picnic areas as we are participating in the various activities. A meeting will be held in the spring to plan a menu. Money for meals on the road to and from Yellowstone as well as souvenirs will have to be budgeted by the scouts themselves. (The Hampton Inn has a free continental breakfast!)

Mr. Winston will collect money from those who have already signed up. The reimbursement policy is as follows: All of your money will be reimbursed if possible if you have to cancel. The hotel will allow cancellations no later than 72 hours prior to the nights stay so cancellations within 3 days of leaving will result in room charges for the first night. Yellowstone will prorate the group fees for the 2nd-5th nights of camping so you will have to pay for 1 nights camping.

New Trailer ! Mr Bailey and Mr. Siepker have been searching extensively for a new trailer. Their extensive research has determined the problem is very complex.

- 1) A single axle Trailer (Like the one we have) is able to carry slightly more weight if we beef up the springs. This option is cheaper but may not meet the capacity needs. It's simple, doesn't require brakes.
- 2) A dual Axle Trailer – can carry up to 7,000 lbs, but is heavier making it difficult to move into and out of the shed by hand, requires electric brakes (Which means the tow vehicles have to have a controller) and are more expensive.

THE COMMITTEE HAS DECIDED TO MOVE FORWARD ON BUYING A USED TRAILER

– Thanks to the hard work of Mr. Bailey who weighed 100's of options features and caveats.
